He has received more than a half a million dollars from a number of the financial sectors, but being in the House isn't as lucrative as being in the Senate. Representative Spencer Bachus is the Ranking Member (the most senior Republican) on the House Financial Services Committee. He, Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi and Minority Leader John Boehner (the latter two not members of the committee) also received significant campaign contributions from the financial services industry over their careers. These contributions grew as their seniority and influence grew.
